Beatrice Board of Public Works residential customers may qualify for incentives on certain electric power equipment to help them beautify and electrify their outdoor space.

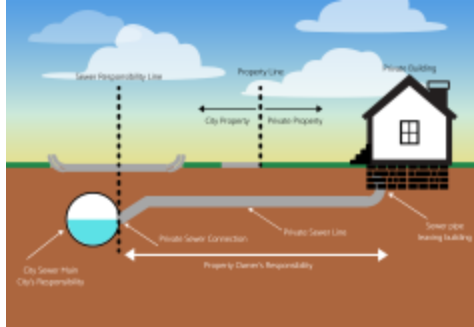
